Curriculum News

What's been going on in school recently?



In addition to all the fantastic learning in our classrooms, we have also been learning outside the classroom; here are a few of the highlights from the last few weeks...

Black History Month

During the month of October, each class spent time learning about a key figure in Black History. The children learned about the key figures in history through English, history, art, music and shared their knowledge and understanding with their friends in the other classes. The children really enjoyed learning about the key figures in history.
