School lunches

Parents, a polite reminder to ask you to ensure that you **pre-book** your child's lunch choice before the new day/week starts with your child/ren and talk to them about what they will be having for lunch. The children are enjoying the new system, menu and food choices on offer at lunchtimes, but if the children don't know what they are eating for lunch they get upset because they don't want the choice that has been chosen for them and want another choice seen. It is important to remember that the food is prepared on our school site based on the orders that we receive from School Grid. You can also add onto this system and update on your child's allergies or dietary requirements which help us immensely with knowing your child's allergies and needs for lunchtime, this is very important.

Pupil Premium funding

Free School Meals/Pupil Premium - you can easily help the school get more funding to spend on the children. If you receive certain benefits you could help the school to obtain precious extra funding called 'Pupil Premium.' As you know, all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a free school meal every day - however, if you receive benefits it's still important to apply for free school meals even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 - that is the only way the school will receive pupil premium funding. It is the same case if your child is in Year 3, 4, 5 or 6 and they prefer to bring their own lunch - if you apply for free school meals you need never actually take a free meal - we will still receive pupil premium funding for up to 6 years. This funding is very precious to us and is spent 100% on the children - helping them in a number of ways and opportunities and experiences to achieve the highest standards possible and make the best progress they can.

<u>How to apply</u>: You can get a form from the school office and Mrs Slater will send this to the authority or apply online : www.Sandwell.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals to check your eligibility. We are very grateful for your help.
